Is this the first ebulletin from the School of the Future Parents Association you've seen in a while? Your emails may be bouncing.

The PA sends, on average, 1 to 3 emails per week. Our bulk email program recommends the following to avoid bouncing:

1) Put SOF_Parents@mail.vresp.com and the domain mail.vresp.com in your email address book and safe senders list, if you haven't already. Or, if you whitelist addresses through your email service provider's tech support, pass those two addresses on to them.

If you have a spam or junk folder on your email address you might check there for PA emails also.

2) Open emails from SOF_Parents@mail.vresp.com (SOF ebulletins) and click on links of interest. Over time, anti-spam programs may read lack of interaction with email from a certain address as a sign that such email is spam.
